From Our Interim Pastor for Preaching ...

## "Lord, what do you want me to share from Your Word with Your people?"

This question is always on my heart and mind as I prepare to preach each sermon. God calls me to be true to the Scriptures and to be alert to the needs of the people. The old saying that a sermon should "comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable" shows the sweep of the preacher's task. Peaching is more than teaching. It is a call from one heart to another to walk with Jesus in trust and in faithfulness.

Above all I need to have the Holy Spirit fill me. Then God's Word can speak to my heart so I can address the hearts of the people of God. For this I ask for your prayers. With the coming of autumn, I will begin a new series of messages in the Gospel of Mark. In his introduction to Mark in the Message Eugene Peterson writes,

An event has taken place that radically changes the way we look at and experience the world, and he can't wait to tell us about it. There's an air of breathless excitement in nearly every sentence he writes. The sooner we get the message, the better off we'll be, for the message is good, incredibly good: God is here, and he's on our side. ... He doesn't want us to waste a minute of these precious lives of ours ignorant of this most practical of all matters—that God is passionate to save us."

I look forward to journeying with you into this "Greatest Story Ever Told." So, fasten your seat belts! It's going to be a wonderful ride.

## Dear Church Family and Friends,

The heart of Cathedral Kitchen is their **Meal & Outreach Program** that serves more than 350,000 meals each year. Dining Room service is available Monday through Friday, To-Go meals are handed out on Saturdays and groceries are shared with guests all week long. Beyond that, food waste management is a huge concern. While many people don't have enough to eat, food waste across the nation is on the rise. Up to 40% of the good, safe food produced in America never makes it to people's plates (*Feeding America*). Cathedral Kitchen partners with grocery stores, restaurants, and farms to provide more food to those who need it most while reducing the amount of food that goes to waste and fills landfills. They pass on any donated food they can't use to other organizations and individuals that can use it. Food scraps from meal production are donated for animal feed and composting. Your donations support this ongoing effort and show the love of Jesus in a tangible way. Indeed, hunger continues but so do we!

#### **GUIDELINES FOR MAKING SANDWICHES:**

- Sandwiches should be made no earlier than 1 day prior to donations and refrigerated
- Cathedral Kitchen requests we work on sanitized surfaces & wear gloves
- Any type of bread is fine (wheat is even better)
- Turkey or \*Beef Bologna with Cheese \*(religious/cultural preferences)
- NOTE: Peanut Butter and Jelly Sandwiches.... please place peanut butter on each slice of bread with jelly in center
  to prevent soggy sandwiches
- Please do not include dressings (mustard, mayo, tomatoes, etc.)
- No need to slice sandwich in half
- Place each sandwich into a sealed plastic baggie & label appropriately
- Please separate PB&J Sandwiches from Turkey/Beef Bologna with Cheese
- Place all sandwiches into a plastic or paper bag and label appropriately

We will continue to collect and deliver donations to Cathedral Kitchen on the 3rd Thursday of each month. Invite a friend or neighbor to join us on Thursday, September 18th between 10:30AM-11:30AM at the First Baptist Church Parking Lot.
